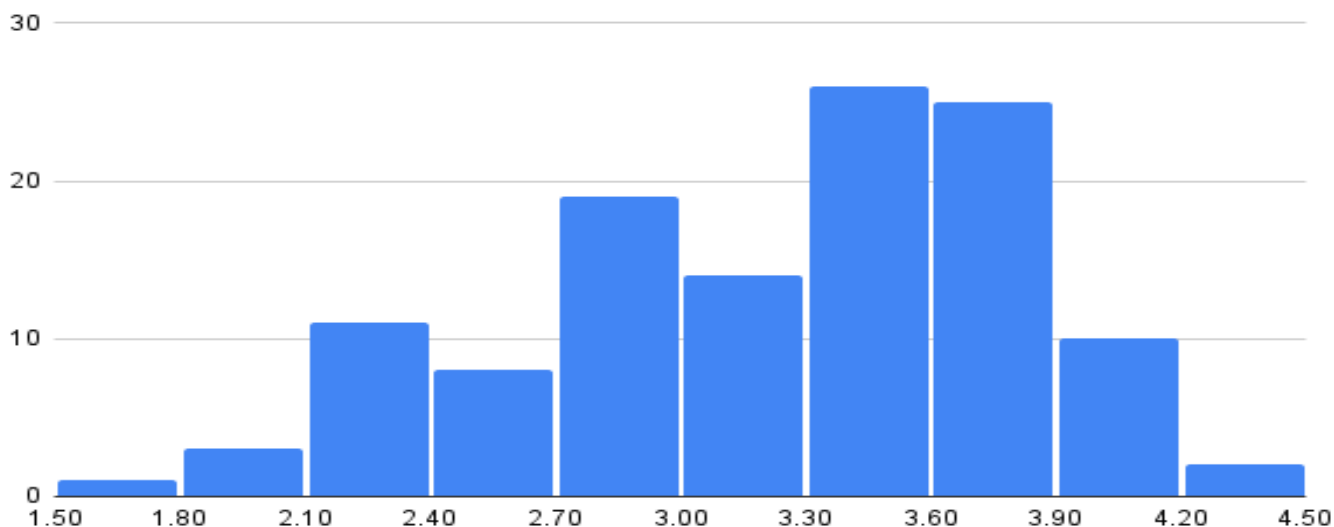
The Curriculum
